Principles & Practice of Cosmetic Science Intensive Residential Course

The Society of Cosmetic Scientists has been one of the leading authorities in the industry, delivering educational programmes in the many fields of cosmetic science and at all levels.

The most prestigious of these is the Principles and Practice of Cosmetic Science course, which has been in existence for over 40 years. It is held biennially and is residential, lasting for a week. The course has been constantly updated to maintain its pre-eminent position. It is renowned worldwide as an arduous but rewarding immersion in cosmetic science.

The course is particularly suitable for scientists who have been working in the Cosmetics Industry and the allied supply and support industries for a few years and are looking to move in to more managerial or supervisory roles, primarily, but not exclusively, in the technical functions. It is also suitable for the more experienced manager, who requires updated information on the technologies associated with the development of personal care products or a speedy immersion into a new field of expertise. The minimum educational requirement for the course is a degree, preferably in a science subject, however, other qualifications or relevant experience may be considered.

With the requirements of all types of participants firmly borne in mind, the course consists of a wide range of lectures and tutorials, with ample time for question and answer sessions. These lectures and tutorials are given by eminent practising cosmetic scientists and academics: many of who are recognised internationally within the industry as experts in their field.

The course members also participate in a challenging product development exercise. The exercise is carried out by competitive groups of students, is computer controlled and designed to encourage the application of the science and product technologies covered during the lectures and tutorials. The formal teaching sessions, on any given day, will provide information and set problems relevant to the work on the exercise. Additionally, lectures and group exercises will be provided

on relevant managerial skills, such as team working and managing creativity. The objective is to maximise the learning experience of the participants. The exercise, which takes place throughout the course, comes to a climax in the form of presentations given by each group to guest judges playing the roles of Board members. Competitive groups of the course participants are also given a practical 'hands on' opportunity to work with perfumes and perfume ingredients, following a lecture on perfumery.

The fees for the course are inclusive of all meals and overnight accommodation. The course commences on Sunday afternoon with a welcome by the President of the Society of Cosmetic Scientists, followed by a general introduction to the course by Administrators at 14.30 hours. It concludes at 14.00 hours on Friday. Overnight accommodation on Friday can be provided as an optional extra.

Cancellation/Substitution Policy:
